The high-speed Internet providers are tired of fighting the Federal Communications Commission's efforts to bring net neutrality rules to the United States. So they're seeking to strike a deal with Washington. That could mean eliminating the FCC's power to enforce regulations on broadband providers in return for easing the agency's restrictions on who can buy which broadband licenses and which types of applications will be allowed over the Internet. But what would be gained from that side deal? The nation's top Internet providers, including Comcast and Verizon Communications, want to avoid new federal regulations so they can provide the Internet to all Americans as they see fit. So they're trying to extract some reforms from the Obama administration in exchange for allowing them to continue as they are. Last week, Comcast and Verizon Communications submitted a joint proposal to Congress asking for changes to a section of the Communications Act known as section 706. The section, which was added to the Act in 1996, grants the FCC authority to regulate the "unjust and unreasonable discrimination" Internet providers make among consumers. Specifically, the Section 706 provision is known for granting the FCC authority to regulate the conduct of Internet service providers, but there's a catch: The FCC must make a finding that the Internet is an "information service." In a nutshell, that means the provision can only be used to regulate a business that provides a service that transmits information, not one that provides a service that delivers information from one site to another. So, for instance, the provision can't be used to regulate a provider of, say, plumbing, because that service can be described as a public utility. Verizon and Comcast hope that by agreeing to change that definition in exchange for dropping a number of enforcement actions, the FCC will not be inclined to exercise its powers under Section 706.
